The Wilderness Hispanic Mission

Here in Spruce Pine we had to close the church last year for a few months. Our church is now having services again on Thursday nights and on Sunday mornings, and we are hoping to be able to open our Sunday School classes next month.

The situation in México is a bit harder, for the Mexican government has not allowed the churches to open up. The Wilderness Camp in San Fernando, Tamaulipas, México is still closed and only two families are there full-time. Pastor Heliodoro Estrada is having home Bible studies and working on a new church plant down in Michoacán, México.

We are working on a new church plant in Veracruz, México with Pastor Ilarión Vásquez. Please do pray for all of these ministries that are going through a very difficult financial crisis.
